Speech by Senator Vivienne Poy ORBIS Flying Eye Hospital Canada Goodwill Tour Grand Cocktail Reception

Friday July 15, 2011

Welcome friends:

It is indeed a pleasure to visit the ORBIS Flying Eye Hospital again. I first toured it in Toronto in 2006 with my husband and my staff. Wait till your turn for the tour, and you'll realize why it has such an important impact in the developing world.

ORBIS Flying Eye Hospital helps to restore sight to those who have gone blind in developing countries. It reaches out to so many people through education, training, and capacity building. It has, over the years, transformed societies by giving developing countries the greatest possible asset – knowledge and expertise, and the best hope for long-term, sustainable solutions to avoidable blindness.

As a Chinese Canadian, I am keenly aware of the expansion of our communities in Canada. Chinese has been the third most spoken language in Canada since the year 2001. In B.C., our population is approx. ¹/₂ million, and rapidly becoming the majority in cities like Vancouver and Richmond.

ORBIS Canada is very proud to have the nationwide support of our communities. And, thanks to the diligent work of the ORBIS Canada Chinese Advisory Council, over \$1 million dollars has been raised to support ORBIS projects in rural China.

Do you know that, in China, 6.6 million people are blind, mostly in the underserved rural areas? One of the important projects of ORBIS was the successful implementation of the first retinopathy of prematurity program (ROP) at the Guangzhou Children's Hospital, incorporating an examination and treatment network, and screening equipment.

ORBIS is very involved on many continents. Can you imagine, in Ethiopia, where 1.2 million people are blind, there is only 1 ophthalmologist for every 2 million people?

Another example of the work of ORBIS was, last year, with \$½ million from CIDA, ORBIS committed to strengthening the capacity of pediatric eye care services in Vietnam. There are many, many similar projects in different parts of the developing world.

I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge and thank the many ORBIS volunteer health professionals and the Flying Eye Hospital pilots and engineers. Because of their generosity, ORBIS administration costs are very low, with the vast majority of funds being spent directly on programs.
